When Peter was come down out of the ship, he walked on the water, to go to Jesus. But when he saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord save me-Matt 14:29-30

He said that Brother Gardner had helped him and his family. He lives a couple miles east of the mission. He heard the church bell ring one morning, and said to his grandfather, "Did you hear that?' "Hear what?' "Gardner's church bell is ringing." His grandfather said, "Did Gardner come back to life?" The bell ringing can be heard across the valley for a couple of miles.
